SECONDARY NEWS

Nothing Standard About English!

HSC Standard English is ramping up as we hurtle towards our Trial Examinations! We are working hard, fine-tuning their responses to questions and revising their texts in order to perform the best we can in these high stakes tests. Both the Standard and Advanced courses sit two examinations in English - Paper 1 comprises of the Common Module: "Texts and Human Experience" features short answer questions on unseen texts; and an essay task for our prescribed texts - in Standard, we studied Arthur Miller's play, 'The Crucible'. Paper 2 has three sections, one for each Module studied - we've looked at Henry Lawson's Short Stories, The Truman Show and a variety of short texts.

So what can we do to best prepare for these exams?

- Revisit our texts and know them thoroughly
- Learn quotes that are: a) easy to remember and; b) can be used for any question
- PRACTICE EXAMS both timed and untimed past papers and questions are easily located on the internet and on Canvas
- Write stories
- Invent characters that can walk into the exam with us for support!
- READ a broader vocabulary is always helpful!
- Know language techniques how they work and why

How can our families help us?

- Read our work give us feedback!
- Ask questions about our texts so what's it about? Who are the main characters? Why did the author write it? What were they trying to do? What do you think about it?

When it comes to the Big Dance, the HSC, English exams are usually first. Not long to go now! With hard work, study and with God's help, we can succeed in our undertakings!
